

**Review prior to class:**

**Yellow, Red and Blue are the primary colors.** From these three all others are made. (except white).

Primary Yellow and Primary Blue make a Secondary Green. Primary Blue and Primary Red make a Secondary Purple (aka Violet). Primary Red and Primary Yellow make a Secondary Orange. When you mix a primary with a secondary you get a tertiary (aka intermediate color). We will go over this in depth. I suggest using a double primary trio because then, you have a larger range to choose from. When in class, you will see how to use both a single set of primary colors and a double set of primary colors. Below is a general idea of what we will have from just Red, Yellow and Blue. Just getting started, learn the basics with templates I will bring along. More advanced? You will receive more in-depth exercises to do so bring your own photo references for some of the exercises.

Wait, no black or brown or neutrals in this supply list. We can mix all these from these three colors plus white. I will show you how. Let's have fun mixing and playing with color!

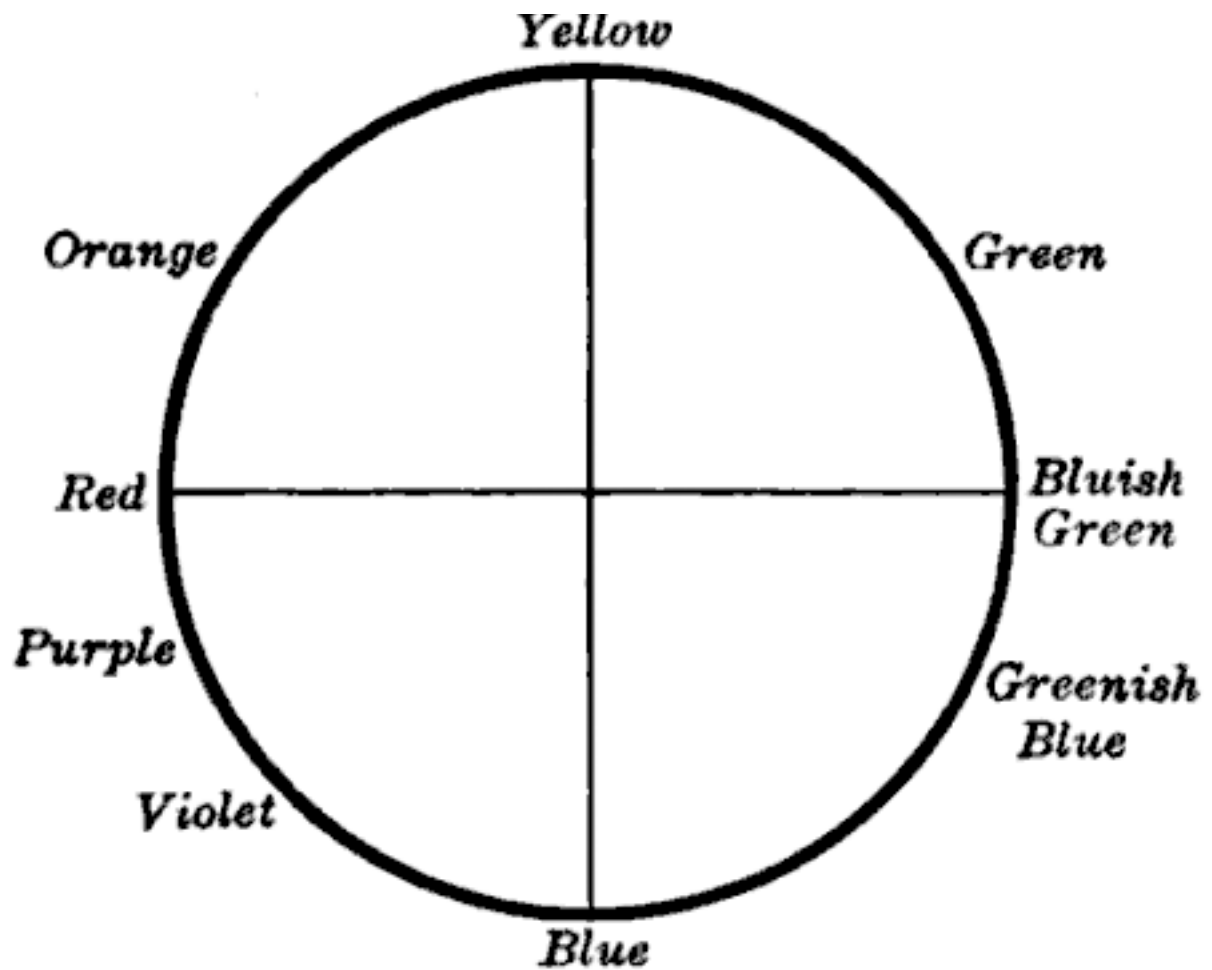


FIG. 23. Color circle

The center of the circle represents white. All colors placed at opposite ends of diameters of the circle are complementary colors
